In a time of uncertainty, may 5781 be a year of blessings for our families, our community, and our world.



A Home To All People

In many ways, our High Holy Day prayers come to a climax in a little noticed verse at the end of the Amidah. Just after we sing “Hayom, Hayom, Hayom” we recite words of the prophet: “I shall bring you to my holy mountain and make you joyous in My house of prayer. For My house shall be called a house of prayer for all the people.”

These words were first uttered 2500 years ago by the prophet, Isaiah. Speaking to Israelites living in exile, Isaiah offered hope that they would one day return home. God would gather the dispersed, restore their nation and rebuild their central place of worship. That Temple, Isaiah promised, would be a House of Adonai for the entire people including “foreigners” who attached themselves to the Jewish people.

In this reading, Isaiah paints a vision directed specifically to the Jewish people. (Note, the Hebrew says, “My house shall be called a house of prayer for THE people.”) He expresses the hope that one day we will be united as an extended family of faith. However, this verse is understood to have a broader, universal message. For example, our machzor translates, “My house shall be called a house of prayer for ALL people.” That is a beautiful message. It imagines the Temple as a place of radical hospitality where all are welcome. It imagines a time of universal brotherhood in which all people worship together.

The holiday of Sukkot has a similar universal message. Our haftarah readings described the messianic era when there would be only day (“Hayom”) and not night, a time when all people would ascend to the Temple beseeching God for life-giving rain.

How far we are from this vision! Not only are there deep divisions between people, nations and faiths, no one can even go to shul. Today, our building is sadly a house of prayer to no people.

But there is another, powerful way to read this verse. If we understand it and if we implement it, perhaps we can achieve the vision Isaiah sets out. Do not read “for” but “to”- “My house shall be called a house of prayer TO all people.” That is to say: our homes are to be places of prayer. They are to be permeated with the sights, sounds, smells, traditions, values, and morals of the Jewish people. Our homes are our Temples.

One day soon, God willing, we will again be able to open our homes and our shul to others. For now, as we sit in our sukkahs, we are called upon to work toward this vision. When we participate virtually in services, classes, and gathering, we extend Beth El and make each of our residences a House of God. We transform our houses into sanctuaries and make our homes a light unto the nations for all people.

Our homes are to be places of prayer. They are to be permeated with the sights, sounds, smells, traditions, values, and morals of the Jewish people. Our homes are our Temples.

While I know that our Board and our staff are supporting best practices and safety and considering all aspects of what is possible in order for us to open, like many of you I miss our synagogue and I am enthusiastic and excited about that moment when we do open again and I can once again experience the warmth of greeting our community at the entrance to our shul.

Until then, what comforts me is knowing that we are a strong and vibrant community and that we are still able to engage as a community. To learn as a community. To virtually gather as a community. To connect as a community. To serve as a community.

Embracing Uncertainty

Like others, I have watched the people around me respond to the series of events that have unfolded during the year of 2020 as they have expressed disappointment and sadness for how things are not as they expected. I empathize – I miss so many of the things that brought people together physically that we have not been doing for what is now over seven months.

And, while I miss those things and empathize, I try to take moments in time to remind myself of the positive things occurring in my life as well.

For me, Beth El is no different – I miss all of you and our synagogue community. Though, I reflect and have seen us come together in ways we never would have expected, and have accomplished so much – even though there is a lot that people are unaware of because we aren't together in the same way.

Because of that, I thought I'd take a moment to share with you some of the important things that have taken place at Beth El over the last several months as we led up to 5781 and closed the door on our synagogue fiscal year of 2019-20:

- In March, we quickly pivoted and created our CyberShul within weeks, allowing us the opportunity to continue serving our congregants virtually. Simultaneously, our Beth El Caring Committee (BECC) reached out to *every single* Beth El household and developed further check-ins for our at-risk population.
- We immediately established a cohort of subject matter experts to help us make decisions moving forward – always helping to make sure we are aligning our mission & values with them.
- July 1, 2020 began a new fiscal year, and our 2019-20 year closed with in a positive cash-flow result, highlighted by financial responsibility, added layers of controls, great program management, and additional charitable giving.
- Our clergy team worked innovatively to design, create, and implement a new High Holy Day experience under unprecedented conditions.
- Aleph Preschool worked diligently to reopen in early September in order to serve a portion of our congregation that was not able to be served by our CyberShul.
- We have prepared a plan to monitor and manage our finances through a continued pandemic with realistic optimism that we will get through this – together with you.

With all of this, I have embraced the idea that there is no certainty. And, that uncertainty is incredibly uncomfortable. It would not be honest of me to say I know what's next. What I do know is we will continue to find ways to stay connected and maximize the programs and services we offer to you as congregants. We are committed to doing so – and to serving our mission while keeping people safe & healthy.

Everything we have been able to accomplish is *because of you*. You are the lifeblood of Beth El, and I appreciate your engagement, your support, your tzedakah, and your patience.

Thank you for *being* Beth El and for being on this journey with us together.



One of the many things that makes social distancing difficult is the inability to gather to sing. At a time when we need to rejoice with, and be lifted and comforted by song, our voices are silenced. Music videos and zoom solos are wonderful but they are not a substitute for a sanctuary filled with music.

Music fills our spirit and touches our soul. It connects us across generations and across lands. It's no wonder music plays such an important role in Jewish tradition and in the life of Beth El Synagogue. Under the direction and inspiration of amazing cantors, Beth El has grown into a singing congregation. Who has not been moved by Cantor Newman chanting Kol Nidre, or by Cantor Abrams holding us in song at the burial of a loved one? Who has not been moved by the soulful singing of Neilah, or experienced the joy of watching our Aleph Preschoolers sing the Four Questions, the uplift of singing and dancing on Friday nights to a spirited niggun?

That is the power of music. And it is our responsibility to ensure the song continues. That is why the Beth El Foundation is excited to share with you plans to create an endowed chair to support the role of a cantor at Beth El. And who better to name it for than Beth El's most recent cantors who have led the congregation for the last 30 years. Named the Audrey Abrams & Neil Newman Cantorial Chair, these funds will be used solely to underwrite the salary for this critical clergy position.

Of course, the role of the cantor goes far beyond music. As a full member of the clergy team, the cantor teaches, builds community, offers pastoral care, and much more- all infused with music, Torah and their own special spirit. In short, this endowed chair is critical to the future of the synagogue and why projecting ahead, the Beth El Foundation has made this a priority.

We look forward to sharing additional details on this exciting work with the Beth El community in the coming year. We thank the Audrey Abrams & Neil Newman Cantorial Chair Committee for their dedicated work on this important project. Todah!
